# SIGNIFICANCE

- 3. What are the effects these development approaches are having on Solomon Island women and their childbirth experience?
- 4. What child-birthing approaches and assets do women from the Solomon Islands possess?

- Semi-structured interviews
- Observations
- Introductory group meetings
- Women-held diary concept
- Focus groups
- Diary interviews
